- Early Term (Optional)
- End-of-Term (Required)
- Custom Questions options for instructors
- Dashboards for Instructors, TAs, Chairs, and Deans

Early-Term vs End-of-Term

Early-Term

- Optional
- Runs in week 2
- Aim is to provide an early "check" for instructors
 - Course Foundations Check only
- Only goes to instructor

End-of-Term

- Required
- Runs in weeks 9 and 10
- Emphasis is on best practices in teaching and learning
 - Course Foundations Check
 - Course Experiences
 - Graded Work
 - Custom questions
- Instructor, Chair, Dean, and eFile

Custom Questions

There are three different types of Custom Questions (all optional)

- Optional Standardized Questions
- Discretionary Questions Student Profile Questions
- Discretionary Questions Custom Created Questions

You can also select different options for different courses.

Student Access

While this has changed, students now have two ways to reach the new evaluation system:

- They can access it using the unique link they receive in their email
- ► They can access it directly through the UCR Course Evaluations link in CANVAS

One important issue with what students see

- To-Do vs Done resets for the End-of-Term evaluations, but the evaluations are complete and the data is stored.
 - Only an issue if instructors proved extra credit
 - One option is to use the response rates in the dashboard

Dashboards

The purpose of the dashboards is to give instructors the ability to dig deeper into student feedback.

Limits:

- You can only filter by the demographics available
- You can't filter below 3 student responses
- Dashboards are closed during the evaluation period

What about the old iEvals?

The old iEvals have not disappeared. You can still access them:

- You will be able to access them in ievalarchive.ucr.edu through the end of December
 - ▶ I will still be able to pull reports for you until 2037
- You will be able to access them in eFile for however long they normally stay in eFile
